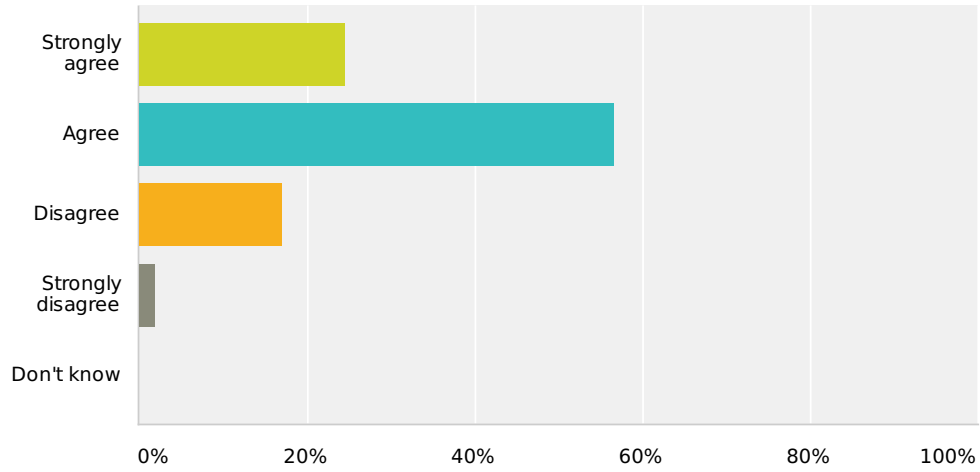

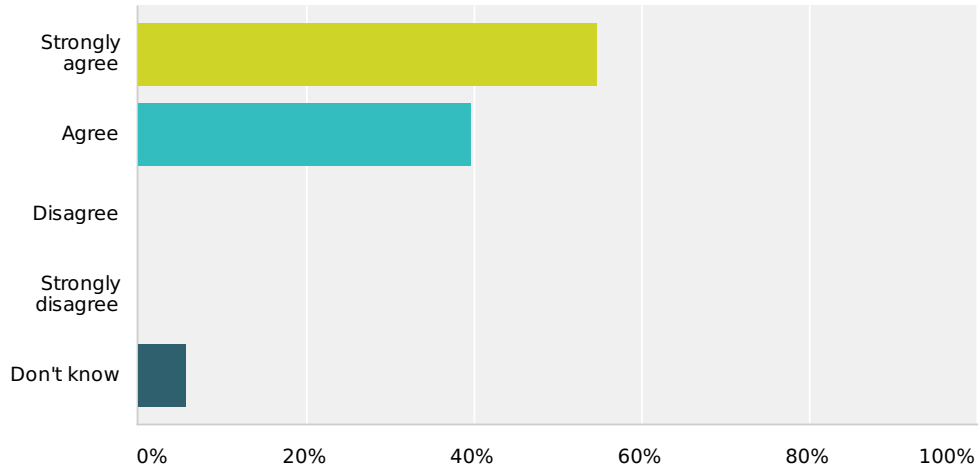

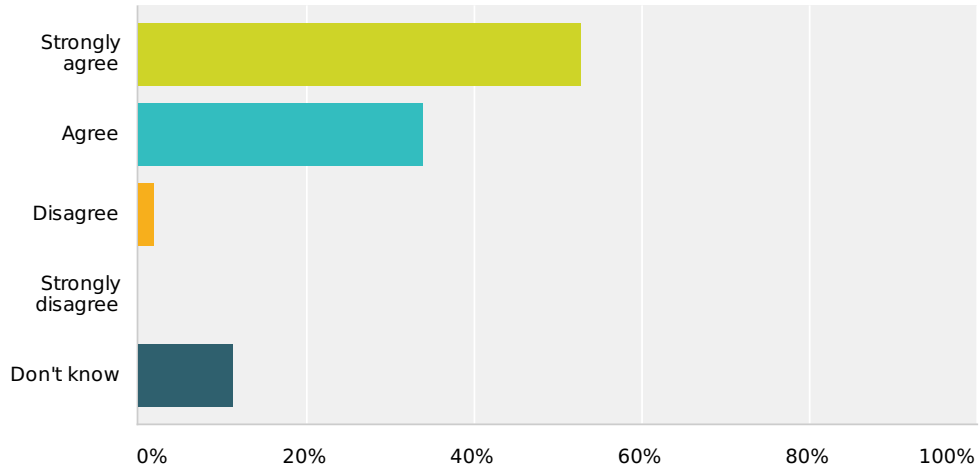

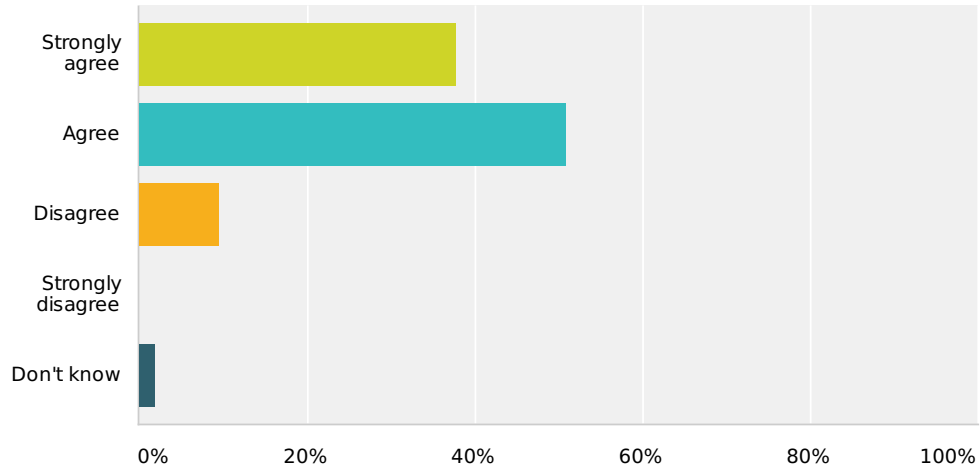

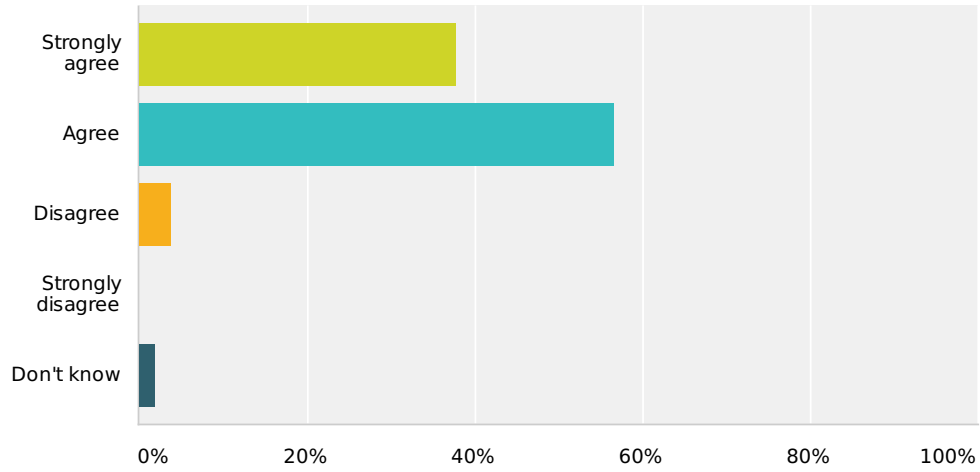

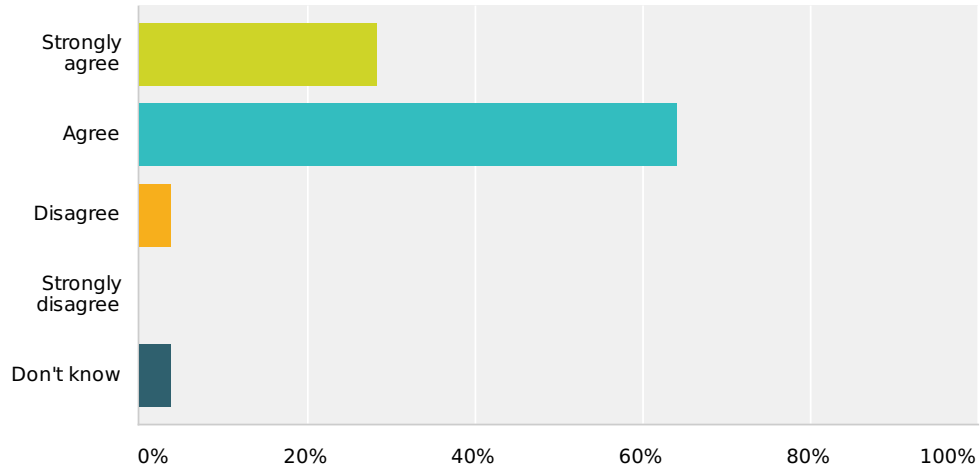

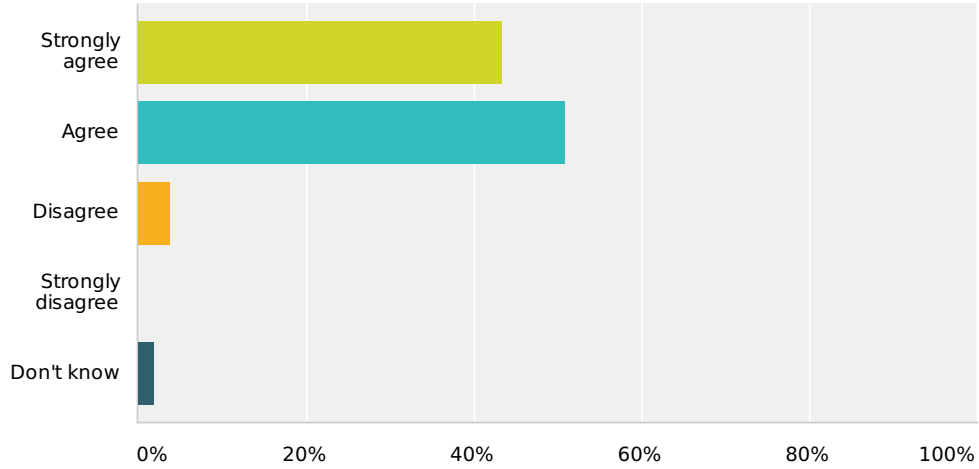

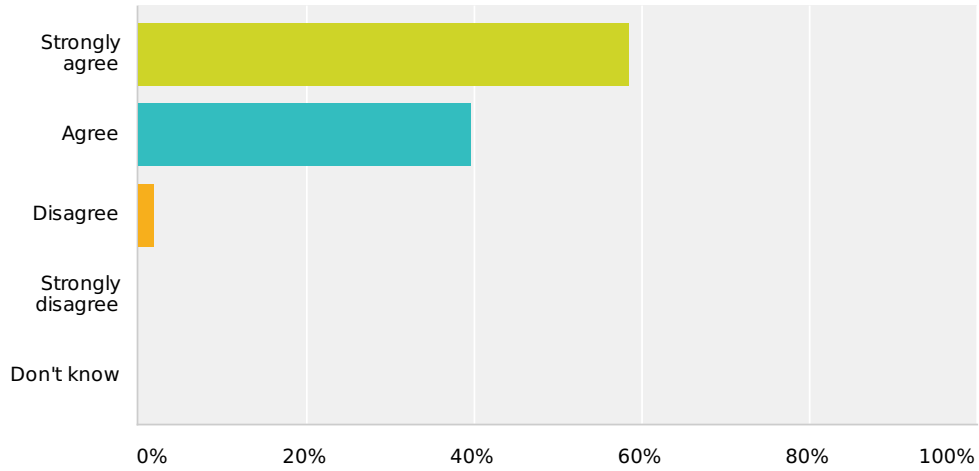

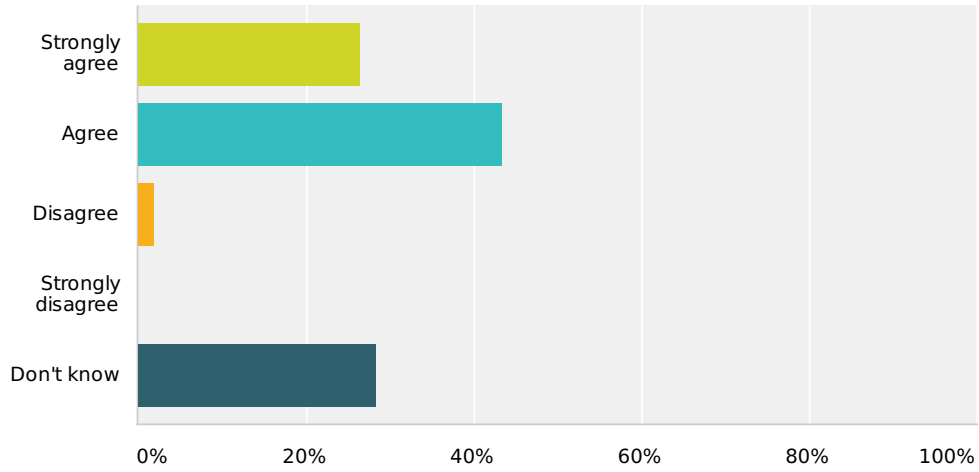

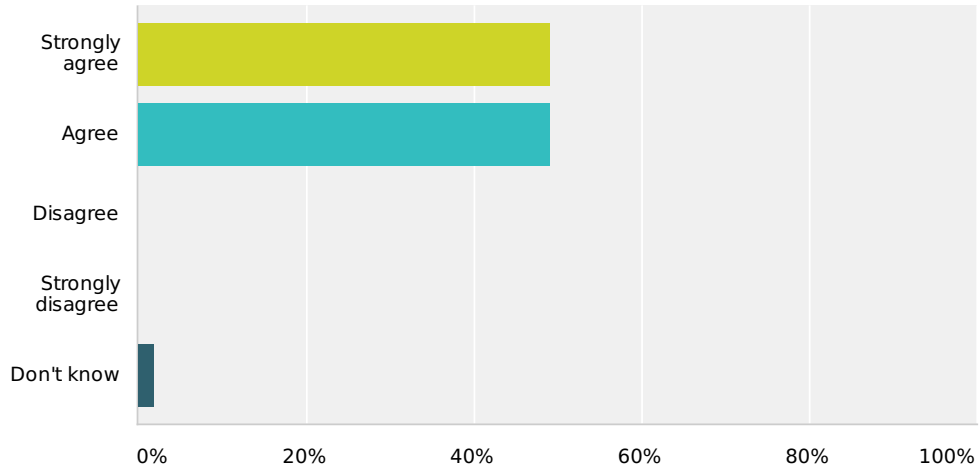

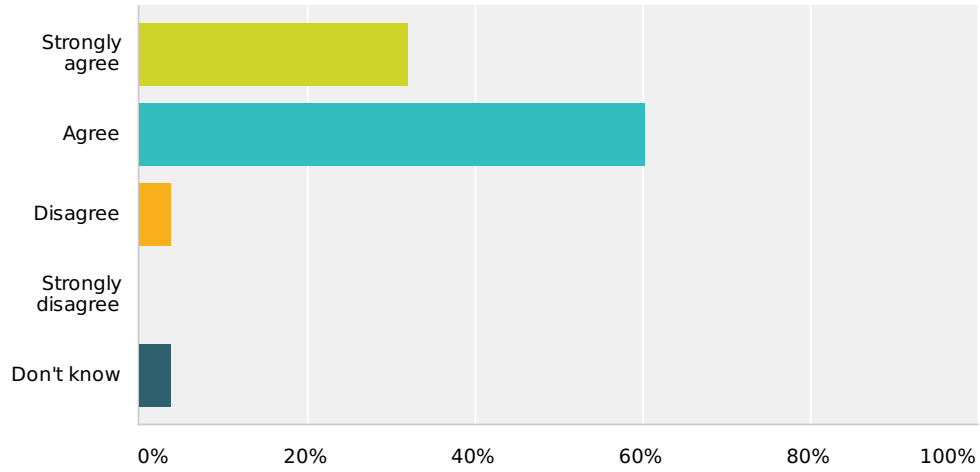

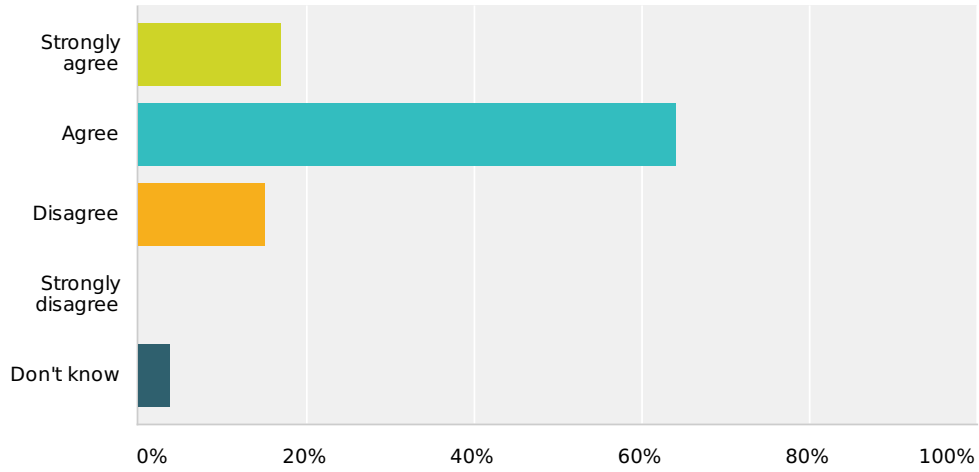

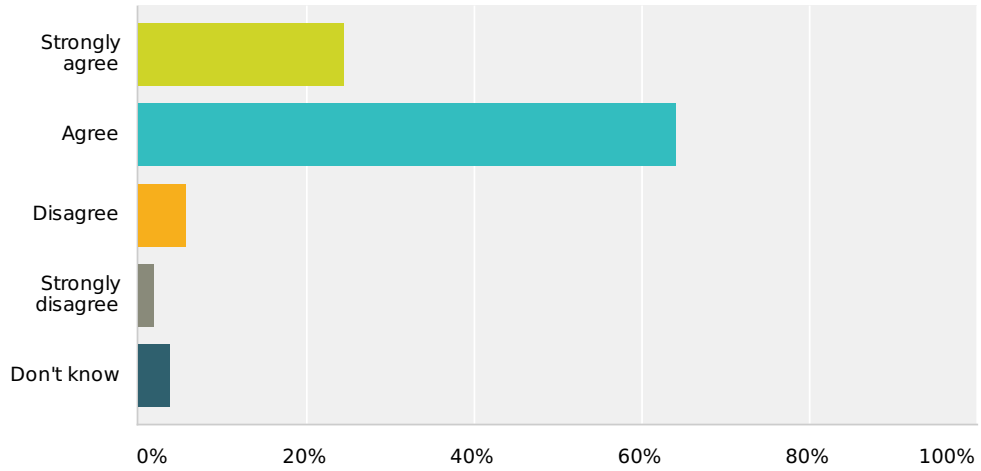

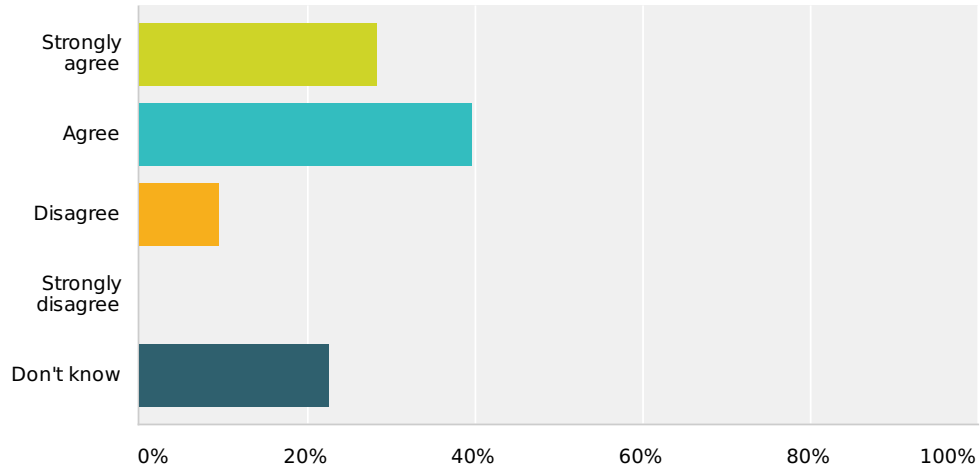

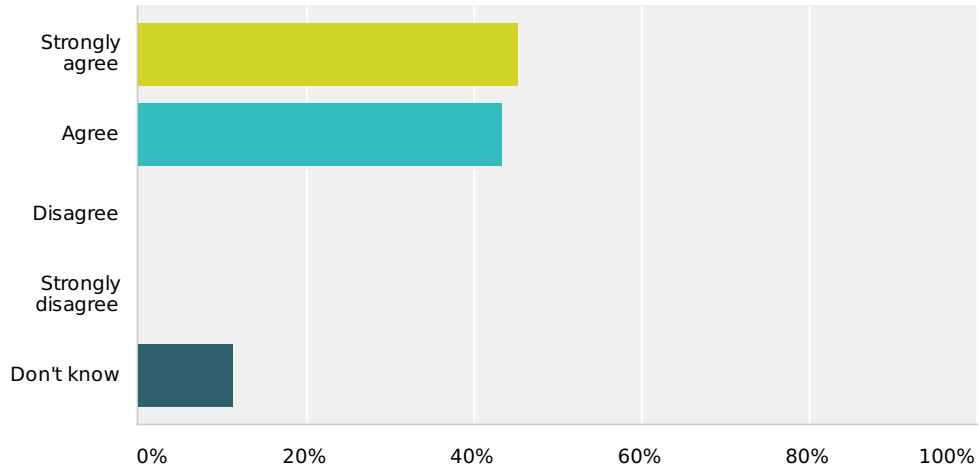

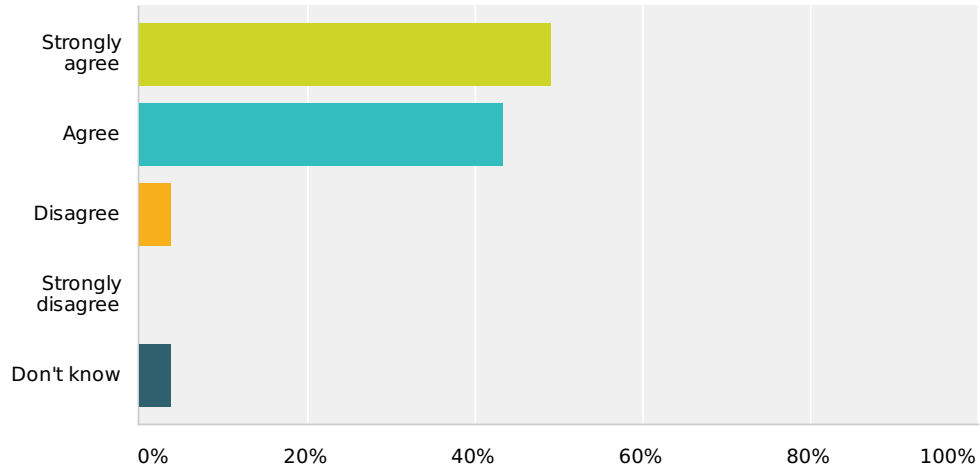

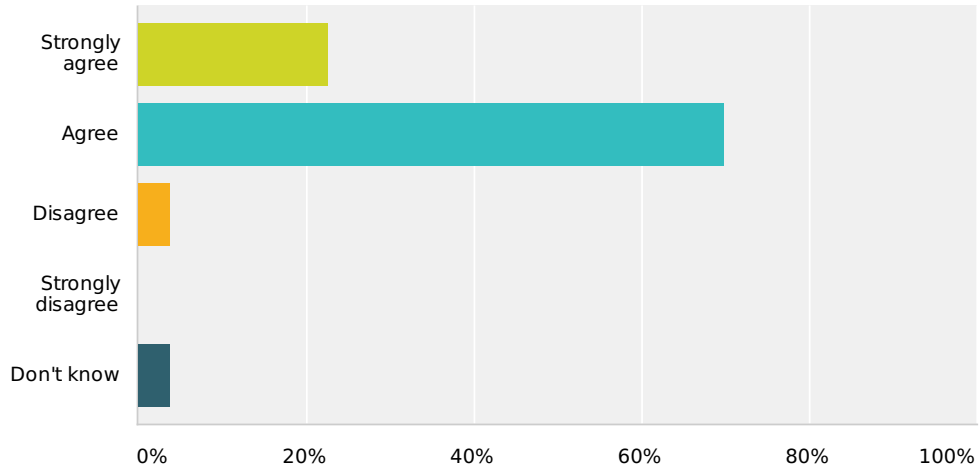

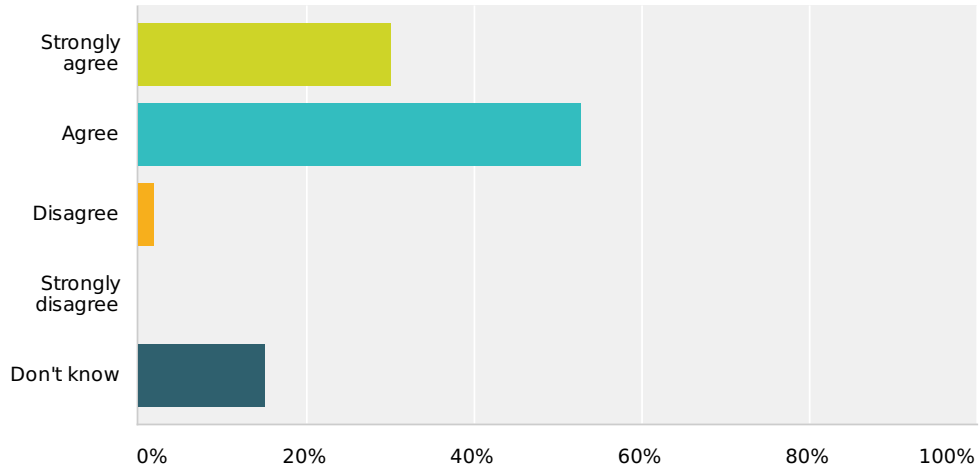

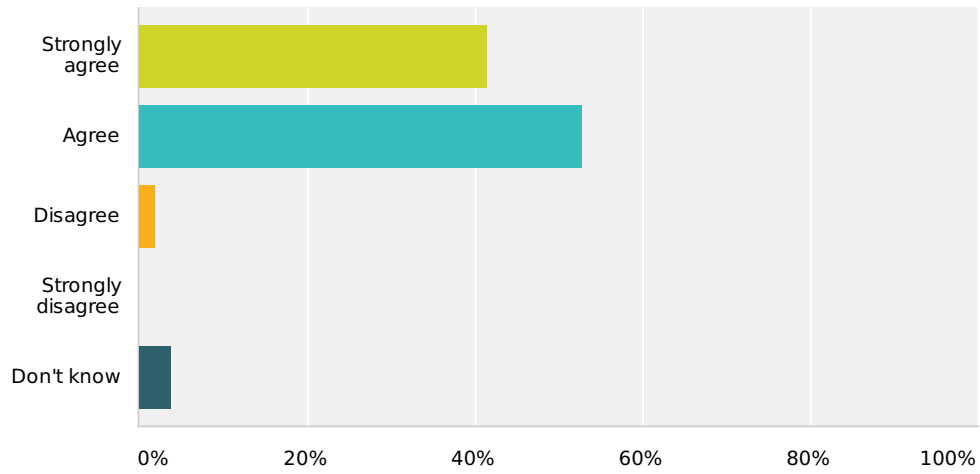

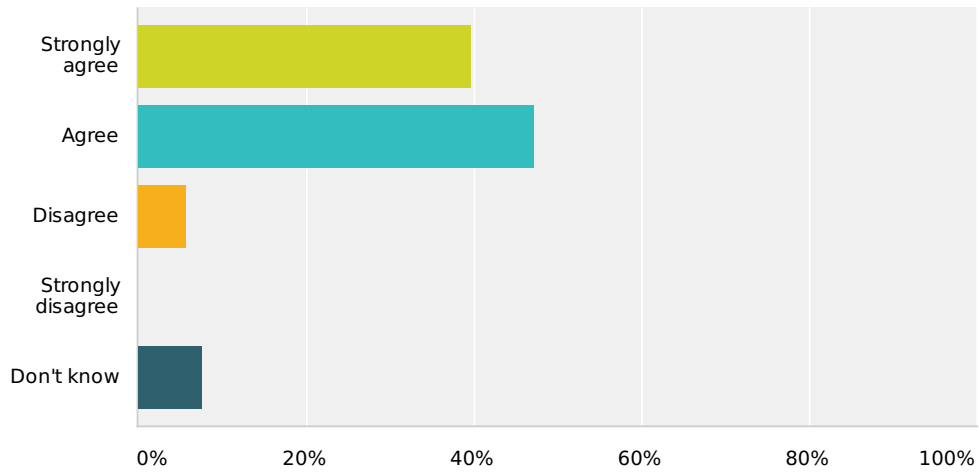

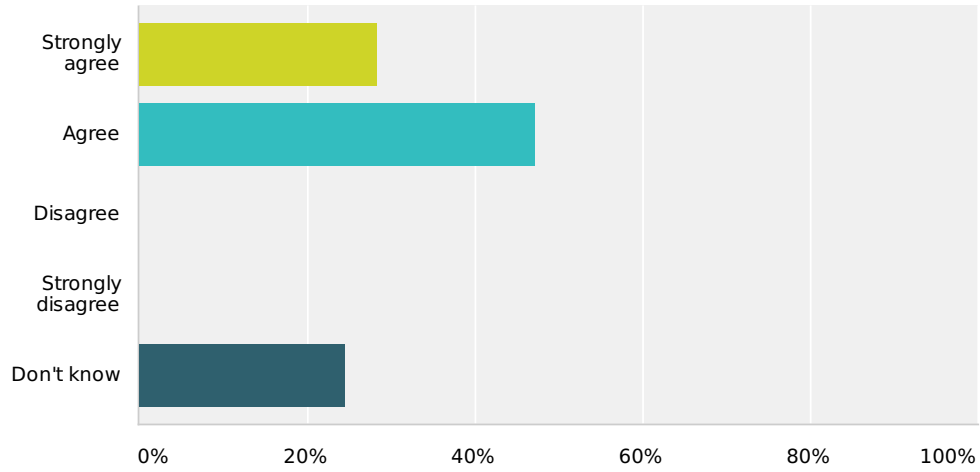

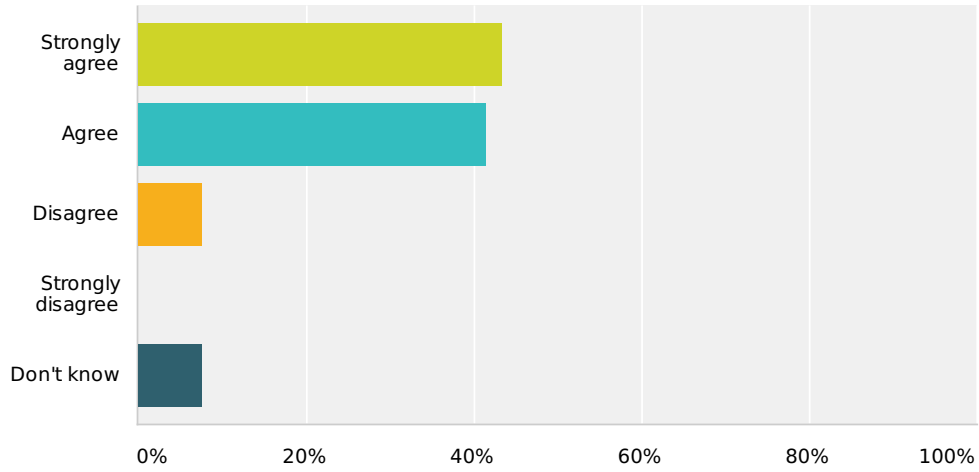

Q26 I know who some of the school governors are

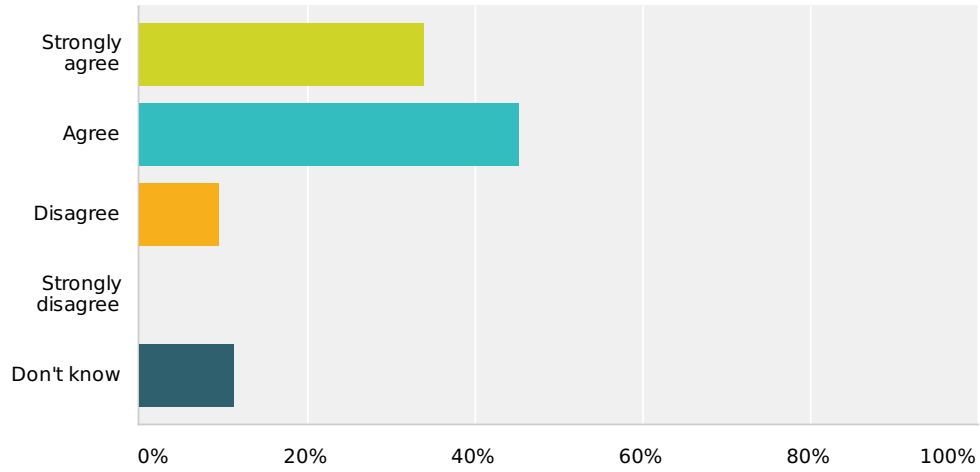

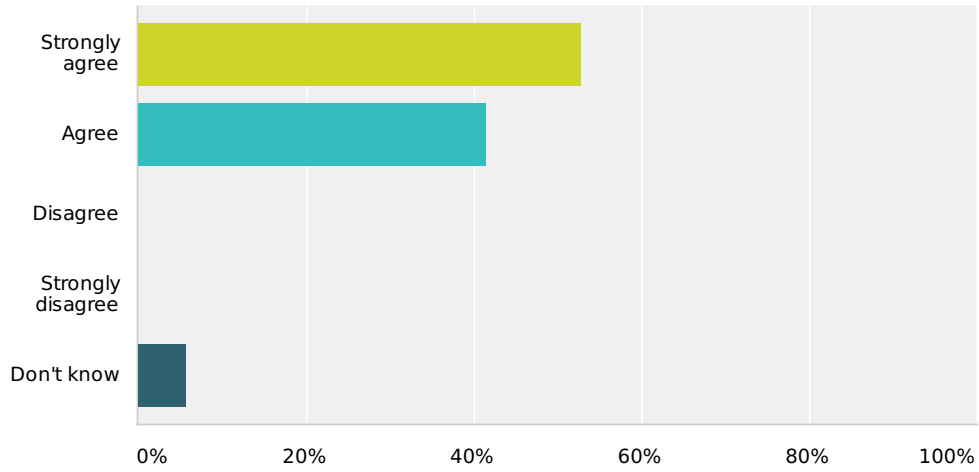

I do wonder though if some systems/procedures could be tightened up in ways that would support the teaching staff and minimise parent frustration. This applies to the day-to-day level (e.g. the morning process of wandering into school and scrambling all over each other to change (wet) shoes is chaotic and so parents often feel the need to go in and help their child out), the termly level (e.g. if we are given codes on school reports why aren't explanatory documents provided to help us interpret them?) and annual level (e.g. couldn't the school put on a some kind of 'Welcome to the New School Year' event in which the Head tells us the school's ambitions for the year, and parents meet their child's new teacher,, and teachers have small sessions in their classrooms during which they can show how they use their classroom, describe their use of small group and full class teaching, explain their general expectations for the teaching year such as how the teaching approach might change over the year, etc.). I think school life is so clear to those that are involved in providing it that sometimes its easy to forget that parents are in the dark (children only tell you so much, and that's mainly about playtime and what they ate for lunch!). Anything that can dymystify the school day will help reduce pressure on teachers to say the same thing over and over, reduce the distance between parents and the school, and generally support good relations. I really liked the phonics/reading sessions the KS1 teachers provide for parents, could we have one on Maths?
